THE MENTORING PROGRAMME



The mentoring programme was launched in 2019, to provide comprehensive support for ISSK students. The mentors are JGU students themselves and, for the most part also graduates of the ISSK.

In this way, the perspective of ISSK students can be better understood and communication at eye level can be ensured.

What do the mentors do?

The mentors are available to ISSK students via various media channels and are always ready to help, from the initial acclimatisation period in Germany up to the application to the university.

Among other things, the following areas are covered:

- Assistance with settling in Germany and at the ISSK
- Assistance with social and academic integration
- Introduction to the educational landscape in Germany and especially the degree programmes at JGU
- Assistance with the application process at JGU

The mentors also organise events during the semester: city and campus rallies, movie nights and much more. In this way, the participants get to know student life in Mainz and have the opportunity to connect with each other.
